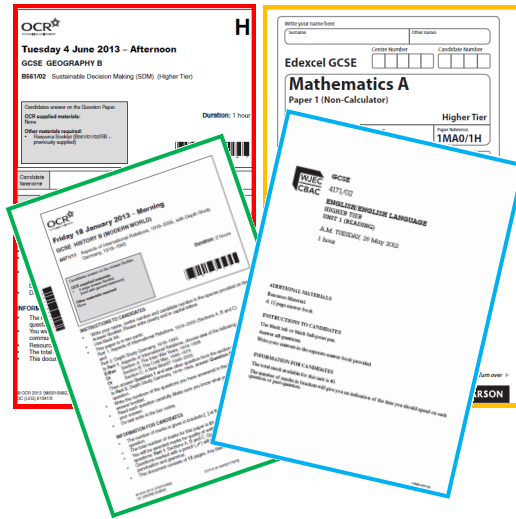


Revise for the Test

Using Past Papers to Revise

Practise the paper in and out of timed conditions.

Learn from your mistakes by following the guidance below



Get used to the question types: "Find", "State", "Describe", "Explain" "Calculate"

Highlight the subject words and technical terms

Mark your work using mark schemes

RISK Rate: identify what you did wrong

Correct your mistakes

RISK Rate Your Performance.

R	Could you read the question?	If no, read slower and take more time to visualise the information. Have check points where you stop and make sure you have understood. If you have a reader in exams, ask for the question to be read to you.
I	Did you interpret the question correctly?	If no, highlight the command words: "describe", "explain", "find" and check you know what to do. Note the number of marks and the answer space so you can judge the length / detail of the answer. Highlight the subject information. (This could be numbers, measurements, names, subject vocabulary.)
S	Did you make a silly mistake ?	If yes, check your workings. Read your answer back through. (If you have a reader in exams, that person can read your answer back to you.) Check you have answered the question.
K	Did you have the knowledge to answer the question?	If not, go back to your notes, revision guides, text books, websites and find the right answer. Do you need to memorise some points better?

Start the next revision session with a recap

The Revision Cycle

Plan a study session with a topic in mind

Briefly revisit the same topic within 24 hours

10 minutes after memorising something, retest yourself.
