

APPRENTICESHIP OF THE WEEK

MEDICAL ADMINISTRATOR



Medical Administrators are involved with providing administrative and secretarial support to various departments and wards around the Trust. On a day to day basis they will provide an efficient, friendly and confidential service to customers, patients and internal staff, will record patient attendance, ensure the public image of the department remains professional. They will also deal with all incoming enquiries through telephone and email, file patient records and enter information electronically where necessary. A successful Medical Administrator will need to be courteous and helpful, have excellent attention to detail, be able to organise work effectively and balance the workload as well as work as part of a team and alone with minimal direct supervision. They will complete a Level 3 Business Administration apprenticeship and may also gain certification in Medical Terminology. A great way to start a career in administration which could set you on a pathway to roles such as Policy Officer or in business management.

CAREER OF THE WEEK LIBRARY ASSISTANT

Library Assistants are generally involved with supporting customers and service users in a library environment through tasks such as helping them access and print resources, organising IT access and answering queries, checking materials in and out at the front desk, cataloguing new resources, shelving returned items and maintaining databases and records. You could enter this role through a Library and Information Services Assistant advanced apprenticeship (Level 3). These take 18 months to complete. Alternatively, you may apply for a permanent role if you have prior experience in an administrative, customer service or IT role, or even better first hand experience of working in a library. You can also gain experience by volunteering or doing work experience in your local library which will be invaluable for any application. Successful Library Assistants will need to have outstanding written and verbal communication, be friendly and polite to all service users, be excellent team players and have thorough attention to detail. You could progress onwards to become a librarian or library manager.
