
Progress 2023



Entry Requirements



- 3 Grade 5 and 2 Grade 4 passes at GCSE
- GCSE grade requirements for each A level course
- For most subjects, a Grade 5 is required in that subject at GCSE
- Grade 6 for mathematics, biology, chemistry, physics and languages
- For new subjects?
- Grades for viable programme of study at least 3; in most cases 4 subjects
