Dear Parents and Carers,

Today we have had 3 positive cases of COVID-19 reported:

- Year 7 student - last in school on Tuesday 3 November
- Year 13 student - last in school on Monday 2 November
- Member of staff - not in school this term

All three are suffering only mild symptoms and it would appear that they contracted COVID-19 during the half-term break given the dates of their first symptoms.

We are continuing to monitor the situation and are working closely with Gloucestershire County Council and Public Health England. All close contacts of the students have been informed and are aware of what is required with regards self-isolation and remote learning from home.

Following the reporting of the positive test in Year 7 today, we sent the whole of Year 7 home as a precautionary measure. We have subsequently informed parents of Year 7 that one side of the year group will need to self-isolate from Monday 9 November until Monday 16 November inclusive.

Close contacts of the Year 13 student have been identified and they are aware of the need to self-isolate. If there are any questions regarding Year 13 please email Miss Khan, [hkhan@klbschool.org.uk](mailto:hkhan@klbschool.org.uk)

I have previously mentioned the increase in the number of cases regionally and nationally and the need for us all to follow government guidance and stay vigilant. I have again attached further information about keeping ourselves safe and what to do in the case of symptoms developing.

As a school we have now had 10 cases of COVID-19 reported by either staff or students. Each one of the cases does appear to be in isolation. We continue to make the safety and well-being of students and staff our very top priority and we will continue to take guidance from Public Health England and Gloucestershire County Council to ensure we have all appropriate safeguards in place.
